



Succeed 2020 aims to improve North Dakota's education and workforce development systems and increase students' achievement in middle grades and high school, access to and success in postsecondary education, and preparation for 21st century careers.

Succeed 2020: Working to ensure a successful transition from school to college and careers for all North Dakota students

The Succeed 2020 project is designed for middle and high school students; putting them on paths to be better prepared for their college and career goals. Specific goals of the Succeed 2020 project aim to increase ACT scores, reduced need for developmental or remedial education, and increase the number of students who complete high school and college programs on time.

North Dakota's eight regional education associations are working collaboratively with multiple stakeholders, including state and local leaders, school districts, higher education institutions, and Native American groups.

Succeed 2020 programs support:

- Expanded college and career counseling
- Teacher and counselor professional development
- Tutoring and other services to help students successfully transition into higher education and the workforce
- Other programs or approaches that address specific regional objectives.

Measures of success:

- Higher ACT scores
- Higher WorkKeys scores
- Reduced need for remediation/developmental courses
- Higher GPA
- On-time graduation for secondary and postsecondary students
